The Nevada Collaborative Conservation Network (NvCCN) is a state-wide network that works to promote and support locally-led collaborative conservation efforts, with emphasis on sagebrush ecosystem conservation and management. Shelly works as the Program Director for the landowner-led non-profit called the Sandhills Task Force and serves as a Board Member for Partners for Conservation, a landowner led organization that embodies a grassroots movement of private landowners to sustain our working landscapes for present and future generations.
